### NSW ARTIST WINS INAUGURAL MINDEROO FOUNDATION SPIRIT PRIZE FOR 2020 LESTER PRIZE

Stacey Evangelou from Kirrawee in NSW was the winner of the inaugural Minderoo Foundation Spirit Prize, as part of The Lester Prize, WA's premier fine art prize. Stacey wins \$10,000 donated by the Minderoo Foundation for her charcoal and white chalk portrait of indigenous athlete Joe Williams entitled *Warrior by Spirit*.

Serena Cowie from Malvern East Victoria was the winner of The Richard Lester Prize for Portraiture of \$50,000 for her oil on canvas portrait of her two oldest friends titled *The conversation*. The winners were announced tonight at the opening Awards night at the Art Gallery of Western Australia (AGWA), where the 40 finalists' works are now on public display until 29 November 2020 in the Centenary Galleries.

Stacey's work was chosen by the Minderoo Foundation Judging Panel who noted "the work is an exemplary reflection of the values advocated by the Minderoo Foundation Spirit Prize. It's a remarkable work that demonstrates the care and empathy between the portraitist and the subject. The work acknowledges the resilience of First Nations people, and celebrates Joe's personal courage and determination."

Minderoo co-founder and co-chair Nicola Forrest further noted, "we are so excited to be working with The Lester Prize. Our new prize recognises outstanding Australian talent and celebrates the values that power us as a foundation. We can't wait to see the incredible work exhibited this year."

Stacey, who was unable to travel to the Awards night due to border restrictions said "thank you Minderoo Foundation for choosing *Warrior by spirit* for the Minderoo Foundation Spirit Prize this year. This award gives me the confidence to continue my art career and to explore new paths within my practice. To be able to develop and continue to convey the human spirit through my work has been made possible with the support of this award and The Lester Prize. My portrait of Joe Williams painted up in ochre is a display of strength, confidence, the pride of heritage and the resilience of history. It was an honour to capture his humble heart and his ability to courageously navigate through life, walking two worlds, connecting to culture and spirit."

Other winners announced included:

- Tony Fini Foundation Artist Prize \$10,000 (selected by artists' peers) was awarded to Sebastian Galloway from Tasmania for their portrait of Pirrin Francis titled *Warm air, cool light*;
- Ashurst Emerging Artist Prize \$5,000 Kierah Falkner Babbel from Preston, Victoria for *Race car ya ya* featuring her grandparents;
- Two Highly Commended Prizes (\$1,000 cash, a \$550 domestic art transport voucher, \$500 framing voucher and \$250 art supplies voucher each) was awarded to Josh Cocking from Broome, WA and Daevid Anderson from Wembley Downs, WA for their respective portraits.

Still to be announced will be the \$10,000 People's Choice Prize donated by the Baldock Family, which is voted by the general public throughout the month-long exhibition.

Formally known as The Black Swan Prize for Portraiture, this award is now in its fourteenth year. It was renamed in 2019 in honour of the award's leading patron Richard Lester AM. The Lester Prize total prize pool available to emerging and professional artists is now over \$85,000, making it one of Australia's most prestigious art competitions. This year a record number of artists entered the competition from across Australia, with more than 750 artists submitting portraits of an Australian, or Australians, that they respect or admire, or a self-portrait.

# The Lester Prize

The Prize has had over 4,800 artwork entries submitted and showcased more than 1,300 finalists from across Australia since its inception. Over the last 13 years, more than 3.2 million visitors have attended its exhibition season events and activities.

### ABOUT THE LESTER PRIZE

The Lester Prize is managed by The Lester Inc, a not-for-profit organisation founded in 2007 to provide an avenue for artists to exhibit works of portraiture within Western Australia. With an annual prize pool worth over \$85,000, it is now one of the nation's most recognised and prestigious art prizes.

Working with government, peak arts bodies and community groups, it plays a critical role in helping to diversify WA's local economy, grow cultural tourism, and activate spaces through creative placemaking. The Lester Prize is proud to provide locals and visitors with the opportunity to engage with the best of the artform each year in a format that puts the artists and community front-and-centre.

The Lester Prize's exhibitions and public events program is targeted at diverse groups in the community and includes artist floor talks, workshops, live art demonstrations and pop-up community activations across the city. The Prize advocates for Australian art and artists through a full month-long exhibition season, which includes:

- Main Exhibition of original artworks at AGWA's historic Centenary Galleries – runs from 31 Oct to 29 Nov 2020
- Big Screen Displays at various locations around Perth including Perth Cultural Centre, Northbridge Piazza, Yagan Square, Myer Forrest Chase – runs Oct – Dec 2020

- Youth Exhibition of original artworks at Brookfield Place Tower 2 (123-125 St Georges Tce, Perth) – runs from 2 to 27 Nov 2020
